CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER'S REPORT:

The CAO advised that he had a property matter to be discussed by Council at an in camera session.

DEPUTATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS:

At the appointed time the Mayor called to order the public hearing to consider the possible implementation of a community improvement plan. Mayor Arnold called upon Mr. Barry Uitvlugt of the Lambton County Planning Department who presented his Planning Merit Report on the issue. Mr. Uitvlugt pointed out that the development of such a community improvement plan should be consistent with provincial legislation and provincial guidelines. A community improvement plan would allow for grants to financially assist environmental studies relative to Brownfield sites and tax relief for new assessment developed on Brownfield sites. A community improvement plan would also allow the municipality to access provincial green funding. It was pointed out that the plan if implemented would pertain strictly to industrially zoned property, with the goal to promote the re-establishment of industrial uses on Brownfield sites. At the conclusion of the public presentation the Mayor called upon those in attendance to ask questions or offer comments.

Mr. O'Brien questioned further development of a community improvement plan would put a municipality in the position of being responsible for Brownfield sites cleanup and relieve the property owner of such responsibility. It was pointed out that environmental cleanup of Brownfield sites would still be the responsibility of the property owner, but that the municipality through the use of provincial resources maybe able to provide assistance. Mrs. Farr questioned whether the community improvement plan would be retroactive, for example, assisting owners of homes on former Brownfield sites. Barry Uitvlugt pointed out that the community improvement plan would be a moving forward scenario and would be based on present day zoning and Official Plan designations for industrial lands.

At the conclusion of the discussion there were no objections to the proposed community improvement plan proposal.

The Mayor declared the public hearing adjourned and Council returned to order.
