In discussion of the information correspondence, Mayor Arnold advised of discussions with MPP Maria VanBommel in an attempt to establish a meeting with the Ministry of Finance officials during the upcoming ROMA Conference to discuss the Township's requests to have the Township reclassified from an urban municipality to a rural municipality in an effort to increase OMPF funding. Council also discussed the invitation from the Sarnia-Lambton Chamber of Commerce regarding an invitation to a Chamber event scheduled for January 28th, 2009. It was suggested that interested members of Council RSVP through the Clerk.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND OFFICERS:

Council reviewed the applications to be heard at the January meeting of the Committee of Adjustment. Councillor Brown had several comments relative to application A1/09. At the conclusion of the discussion it was suggested that Councillor Brown could attend the meeting of the Committee to express his concerns.

Motion #7: That the report received from Sandra Brennan, Coordinator of Planning dated December 30, 2008 recommending that Council collect 10% of the \$1750.00 Development Charge at time of subdivision review and 90% on issuance of building permit be received and accepted.

Council discussed the possibility of increasing the current development charges from \$1750.00 to \$2500.00. Council was advised of the process required if the development charges were to be increased, it was suggested that the Treasurer be asked to circulate to Council, the executive summary of the consultants report considered by Council several years ago which was used as a tool to establish the development charges at their current level.

At the appointed time, the Mayor welcomed Mr. Allan Hunter, a resident of 220 Derby Court to present his request for exemption of the fence height restriction as provided for in the Township's current fence regulation by-law. Mr. Hunter pointed out that there is an approximately 17 foot section of his fence that is approximately 6 ft and 9 in. in height. Mr. Hunter pointed out that after the subject fence was reconstructed in the spring of 2008, his rear yard was landscaped with the addition of fill material in such a fashion that the rear yard fence is less than 6 ft high on the south side, not withstanding the fact that it is approximately 6 ft. 9 in. on the north side. Mr. Hunter advised Council that he consulted all of his neighbors prior to the reconstruction of the fence and the fence was constructed with the agreement of all his neighbors to the point that several of the neighbors assisted in the reconstruction project. Mr. Hunter presented to Council, two letters of support for the fence height from his neighbors and as well, several of Mr. Hunter's neighbors were present at the meeting in an apparent demonstration of support. At the conclusion of the discussion a motion by Councillor Randell to grant the fence height exemption failed to get a seconder and was lost.
