The Mayor called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and asked members of Council to declare any possible conflicts of interest at the appropriate time.

Mayor Arnold asked Director of Public Works Matt Deline to welcome Lisa Courtney and Steve Burns of BMROSS Engineering Firm, who were hosting a public meeting for an MEA Class Environmental Assessment for a new waterline on Lasalle Road, near Aamjiwnaang and the Shell refinery.

The purpose of the project is to connect a break in the Lambton Area Water Supply System (LAWSS) between Lasalle Road and Hill Street where a current break in the main would interrupt water supply to a significant number of residents and large industrial users within the township. They considered three options: a new main on Lasalle, extension of an existing main on Vidal Street in Sarnia, or the option to do nothing.

BMROSS recommends the installation of a 450mm main along Lasalle Road between CNR Railway and Vidal Street. The works are proposed to begin in 2015.

Mayor Arnold thanked the representatives for their presentation and extended his eagerness to work with them through the completion of the project.

COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

Deputy Mayor Gilliland:

Deputy Mayor Gilliland asked staff to consider keeping the Sports Complex open on Family Day as he has been approached by patrons who were looking to use the facility on that day.

Councillor Miller:

Councillor Miller extended his congratulations to Mayor Arnold on his successful reelection to Chair of the St. Clair Region Conservation Authority Board for 2015.

Councillor Randell:

Councillor Randell informed Council of an upcoming Annual General Meeting for the Wilkesport Hall Board to be held on April 30, 2015 and encouraged potential new members to attend.

Councillor Agar:

Councillor Agar informed Council that he attended a booth at the recent OGRA/ROMA convention that dealt with soil contamination. He continued by advising that in speaking with a representative of the Ministry of the Environment, he learned municipalities can pass by-laws to ensure any load of soil being brought to a local recycling or restoring plant must be tested to ensure it is not contaminated. He wondered if this is something the Township could look into related to the potential aggregate recycling yard on Courtright Line.

Moved by J. AgarSeconded by P. GillilandMotion #20That staff be directed to investigate the legality of potential by-laws thatwould require testing of all soils being brought to local recycling yards.

Councillor Kingston:

Councillor Kingston expressed her appreciation for the opportunity to attend the recent OGRA/ROMA Conference in Toronto. She continued by asking how staff were made aware of Council's direction and decisions. Mayor Arnold informed her that staff has a recap meeting the day after Council meetings where direction is given to affected department heads and all motions and directions are communicated to all department heads.

Councillor DeGurse:

Councillor Degurse questioned whether or not the Township typically salts sidewalks and was advised that it is not our practice. The Township contracts out the removal of snow from sidewalks which is beyond what other municipalities do as some pass by-laws placing the responsibility for snow removal on sidewalks on the adjacent land owners.

Mayor Arnold:

Mayor Arnold is concerned with the April timeline for the implementation of odour elimination measures related to the Waste Water Treatment Plant in Courtright. Further, local home owners should be contacted to explain the difference between the proposed "temporary solutions" compared to the eventual "permanent solutions" as the people in the area deserve results.

Mayor Arnold continued by advising Council that he attended a session while at the OGRA/ROMA Conference in Toronto that dealt with asset management and amortization timelines. According to the presentation, municipalities are responsible for establishing their own timelines for asset depreciation which could be crucial for the upcoming operation budget deliberations.

While at ROMA/OGRA, Mayor Arnold attended deputations with the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change and the Ministry of Energy. The deputation with the MOECC was well received where the Minister was unhappy with staff for being unaware of the former hazardous waste facility on Hill Street. The deputation with the Minister of Energy saw Mayor Arnold express frustration that nothing has been done to keep better lines of communication open with the Minister and the Township as to the future plans for the facility.

Mayor Arnold concluded by stating his goal of bringing a larger more modern community hall to Port Lambton. The current hall is too small and he would like to see a new facility able to accommodate 200-250 patrons comfortably complete with a modern meeting room. In his opinion, Brander Park may be a good fit for such a complex where the current parking area could be utilized to moderate costs.
