Public Rezoning Meeting - Surplus Farm Dwelling 1650 Kent Line

At the appointed time of 5:30 p.m., Mayor Arnold declared a public meeting open to consider a rezoning as a condition of severance B07/16 that disposed of a surplus farm dwelling as a result of farm consolidation for a property known as 1650 Kent Line.

Planner - Ezio Nadalin summarized his report and identified that this severance qualified for a surplus farm dwelling severance and that this rezoning was a condition of that severance. The proponent owns a farm and purchased an abutting farm thereby creating an "L shaped farm. In this case, a dwelling presently exists on the retained parcel, thus,

negating the need to prohibit a dwelling through zoning as only one is permitted. MDS presented no livestock issues.
