Mayor Arnold advised those in attendance that the engineer for the report was not present, however, he was on his way to the meeting, the Court would be recessed pending the engineer's arrival.

At 6:50 p.m., Mayor Arnold called the Court of Revision to Order. Councillor DeGurse declared a conflict of interest and made his exit from the Council Chambers.

Mayor Arnold welcomed Mike DeVos, the engineer for the report dated February 10, 2016, to present any changes to the assessment schedules.
