Frank Cowan Company Presentation:

At the appointed time of 6:00 p.m., Mayor Arnold welcomed Stacey and Scott Ewing of Hub International and Tony Commisso of Frank Cowan Company to present the proposed policy for 2017.

General Liability has increased by 9% for the 2017 year as a result of the claim history within the Township but, reductions in other areas have reduced the proposed increase in premiums to 2.59%.

The policy for 2017 proposes no substantial changes, however, there were two further options to consider. One, Cyber Risk Insurance, is something the Township may want to consider as security breaches have become more common in the area. Treasurer - Charlie Quenneville will provide a subsequent report on its advantages and premiums. The other option to consider is a three year guaranteed rate for auto and property rates. While this will allow for greater accuracy for budget purposes, the risk is a potentially significant increase at the end of the three year term.
