We have both Sacred Heart and Riverview Schools assisting us again this year, collecting food and unwrapped gifts for the needy. They do an amazing job.

The Sacred Heart Food Bank will be hosting their annual Cookie Walk at the Community Hallon Dec. 2nd . People donate a dozen cookies or goodies, and then walk through and buy other people goods. This starts a 9:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M.

Each year we have 60 to 70 applications for Christmas Hampers. The Food Bank also purchases and gives out gift cards from No Frills in Wallaceburg, so the families can buy their turkey, milk, potatoes, or whatever else they might need to make a Christmas dinner.
