

Sanitary Fixed Fee

St Clair Township introduced a sanitary fixed fee in 2020 to help the municipality pay for extensive costs related to the sanitary infrastructure upgrades required to improve the operational effectiveness of the Township sanitary system and meet provincial regulations.

Some of the sanitary infrastructure upgrades include:

Odour control measures taken at the Courtright Wastewater Treatment Plant that included effluent and activated sludge recycling systems, the installation of Biotrickling Filtration System each contributing to the reduction of H₂S from the wastewater treatment process and reduce the overall odour levels and meet Ministry of Environment, Conservation & Parks requirements.
