Beaver Meadow School (1896-1964) to hold reunion

All former students of Beaver Meadow School (#24 Sombra, #18 Dawn) will be interested to know that a reunion is being planned for all former students and their friends.

The school came about in 1894 when a group of residents met to discuss the possibility of having a school built. Debentures were sold to raise money for its construction and the school was built between 1895 and 1896.

The first term of school began on Aug. 17, 1896 with an enrolment of 15 students, and it soon grew to include 24 pupils from Sombra Township and 18 from Dawn Township. This blending of students from two different townships resulted in the school being known as a "union school".

Enrolment took a big jump to 57 students around 1945 and 1946 when the Union Gas Company was successful

in finding natural gas in the area and when it developed underground storage facilities. Many people found work with Union Gas and moved their families into the area.

As the years passed, educational jurisdictions changed. In 1963, students from Sombra Township were directed to attend the new East Sombra Central Public School leaving 16 students from Dawn Township remaining at the Beaver Meadow School in 1964. In 1965, these students were directed to attend Dawn Public School.

The reunion to commemorate the school's history will be held at Zion Free Methodist Church, 2951 Bentpath Line, adjacent to the former school site. A stone marker will be dedicated during the reunion at 3 p.m. Guests are encouraged to bring school pictures, a main course dish and a dessert to share at dinner. The potluck will be served at 5 p.m.

2010 operating budget is now set

St. Clair Township Treasurer Charles Quenneville reports that on March 17, council approved the 2010 operating budget of \$7.4 million in net property tax levy. The township portion of the tax rate will increase by an average of approximately 1.36 per cent.

Mr. Quenneville noted this budget was a more difficult one to arrive at due to the township having \$320,000 less in Provincial operating grant to work with. Further, the 2010 net property taxation levy has increased by \$514,000, but \$420,000 in new taxation assessment is being generated to offset the taxation increase. This is due to new growth and to year-two of the four-year phase-in of the MPAC property assessment increase. As a result, in 2010, some residential ratepayers with increased assessments will receive a higher property tax bill than others. Any decrease in assessment will be recognized immediately.

In the general capital budget, 54 projects were approved with a gross cost of \$5.6 million and a net taxation levy of

\$1.5 million. Some of the bigger projects being undertaken include: \$990,000 for an upgrade of the Mooretown Sports Complex of which 67 per cent will be covered by grant funding; \$400,000 for roadwork in the Village of Wilkesport; \$158,000 for work on Main Street in Courtright; \$160,000 for bridge rehabilitation; and \$250,000 which is being put into a reserve for the replacement of a fire truck.

In the sewage capital budget, construction work is continuing on the new Regional Waste Water Plant in Courtright, with \$20 million to be incurred this year. In addition, several water looping capital projects will be undertaken to ensure a more dependable delivery of water to residents of St. Clair Township.

Apartment project discussed

A proposal that would see an apartment building constructed on property to the south of the St. Clair Township Civic Centre in Mooretown has been withdrawn.

At the March 15 council meeting, a public forum was held to discuss the project. It was determined that over 40 residents were in opposition to it, citing issues that included the perceived negative traffic and visual impacts of such a project. The project was initially proposed as a means of creating a more robust tax base in the community, which would, in turn, benefit township ratepayers.

To become a lifeguard, you must complete three training levels: Bronze Medallion and Emergency First Aid (must be a minimum of 13 years old); Bronze Cross (must be a minimum of 14 years old); and NLS (National Lifeguard Service) and Standard First Aid training (must be a minimum of 16 years old).

Qualifications to become an instructor

To become a swimming instructor, there are three training levels to complete: Bronze Medallion, Emergency Aid and Bronze Cross; Assistant Water Safety Instructor (must be a minimum of 15 years old); and the Red Cross Water Safety Instructor and Lifesaving Society Instructor course.
