#### Notice to property owners to destroy weeds

Notice is hereby given to all persons in possession of land, in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter W.5, Sections 3, 16, and 23, that unless noxious weeds and grass over 15 centimetres (six inches) growing on their lands within the municipality of the Township of St. Clair are destroyed throughout the season, the municipality may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the cost against the land, plus an administration charge as set out in the Act. (Minimum charge per parcel is \$50.) The cooperation of all land owners is earnestly solicited.

# Hydrant flushing

Personnel from the St. Clair Township Works Department will be undertaking annual flushing of all fire hydrants connected to the St. Clair Township water system during the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. beginning in June and continuing into the fall. During this maintenance procedure, you may notice some discolouration when using taps, flushing toilets, doing laundry, etc. as some sediment may be drawn into your residence. The department recommends that, if discolouration should occur, you should run the cold water tap for a few minutes or until the discolouration disappears. If the discolouration continues after 10 to 15 minutes of normal use, please notify Public Works at 519-867-2993.

## Sewer main flushing

The St. Clair Township Public Works department is currently flushing all main sewer mains connected to the St. Clair Township sewer system during the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. This activity began in May and will continue into the fall.
