

# The people have spoken - new council elected

There will be one new but familiar face on St. Clair Township council when the new council is sworn in on Monday, Dec. 6. Jim DeGurse, a former Moore Township councillor who also served one term on the inaugural St. Clair Township council, garnered 1,809 votes to become one of the three candidates elected in Ward I. The other two Ward I seats went to incumbents Jeff Agar (1,744 votes) and Pat Carswell-Alexander (1,410 votes.) Mayor Steve Arnold and Deputy Mayor Peter Gilliland were acclaimed, as were Ward II councillors Steve Miller and Darrell Randell. For the township's school board representatives, voters gave the nod to Judy Krall for the Lambton Kent District School Board and to incumbent Carol Bryden for the St. Clair Catholic District School Board. In St. Clair Township, there were 11,209 eligible voters and 4,037 mail-in ballots were received, resulting in a 36.02 per cent turnout. Township Clerk John DeMars says he was not surprised at these statistics given the number of acclamations involved.

Further, Mr. DeMars says he has received a lot of positive feedback about the mail-in voting system. He cited comments from a county official who stated he was very impressed with the system and called it, "the most sophisticated system in Lambton County." Mr. DeMars says the system is convenient and works especially well for those who would have difficulty getting to a polling station. "We put the ballot right on their kitchen table," he said. This is the second time the mail-in voting system has been used and St. Clair is the only township in the county to use it.

### Letter in defence of Lambton Generating Station sent to Premier McGuinty

A joint letter of support for the continued operation of OPG's Lambton Generating Station, signed by St. Clair Township Mayor Steve Arnold, Lambton County Warden Jim Burns and Sarnia Mayor Mike Bradley, has been sent to Premier Dalton McGuinty.

The letter urges the provincial government to consider converting the plant to natural gas and, eventually, biofuel as a cost effective option to its closure. The letter points out there is a need for this additional power generation in the wake of the decision not to build a natural gas-fired power generation plant in Oakville. Further, it points out the Lambton station is a good candidate for retention and its continued operation will be of immense benefit to the area. Mayor Arnold says Lambton G.S. is an important local corporate citizen and the negative effect of its closure would be profound. "The ramification of closure is disastrous to us and to Lambton County as a whole. Approximately 300 employee jobs and those of hundreds of contractors that support the site would be gone," he said, adding, "The station contributes around 17 per cent to our total tax levy." Since the legislation that ordered the plant's closure is now dated, Mayor Arnold hopes the letter will prompt a revisiting of that decision. "It is staggering to think that all parties adopted the off-coal strategy in the last election and no party has committed to revisiting the legislation at this time. Our push is to see the conversion (of Lambton G.S.) become a priority for the province," he said.
