# Police urge public to be "eyes and ears" after rash of arsons

A recent rash of suspicious fires in St. Clair Township has been identified as arson and the Ontario Provincial Police is asking the public to be its "eyes and ears" in an effort to apprehend the person or persons responsible for these fires.

The most recent blaze took place along the St. Clair Parkway in a barn that was unoccupied at the time, but police say the barn's owner is known to sleep there when he is working on the property nearby. Township Fire Chief Roy Dewhirst says this fire could have had tragic consequences if someone had been inside the structure when it burned and this holds true for all of the intentionally-set fires that have plagued the township. OPP Cst. Chrystal Jones added, "We want to avoid a life threatening situation."

But there are still more peripheral consequences attendant to an act of arson. Chief Dewhirst points out that emergency responders from the fire, police and ambulance services risk their lives, not only to fight the actual fire and to search for possible victims, but just getting to the scene. "Emergency responders and even passers-by can be hurt," he said, citing an incident where two fire trucks were in collision while rushing to a fire scene in a major urban area. This unnecessary threat to life and property makes the crime of arson all the more heinous. OPP Detective Constable Bruce Keefe noted, "Arson is a crime the OPP takes

seriously. We are determined to find the person or persons responsible."

Everyone, especially residents who live in the vicinity of abandoned or unoccupied buildings or structures, are urged to be aware of any strange vehicles or people who may enter the area at any time. Cst. Jones says if you have the slightest suspicion about their purpose for being there, don't hesitate to report this activity to the Lambton OPP at 1-888-310-1122. Also, an anonymous tip can be called in to Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222 -8477 where it may be eligible for a \$2,000 cash reward.

# New FM Alert system will provide fast emergency warnings

A new emergency notification system that will eventually cover all of St. Clair Township will be rolled out beginning in June during the Firefighters Field Day in Corunna. The FM Alert system will allow almost instant communication between the public and emergency personnel. When the program is in full swing, every residence will have a small receiver that can be activated via a radio signal and large public buildings such as schools will be outfitted with larger receivers. When activated, these units sound an alarm, exhibit a flashing red light, and dis-



play a brief digital message indicating the nature of the emergency.

phone call system, which proved to be insufficient to the needs of the township. The FM Alert system will be operated in partnership with Blackburn Radio and St. Clair County, Michigan. St. Clair Township Fire Chief Roy Dewhirst says this is ideal since severe storms usually track through St. Clair County first. This allows for a timely warning to be issued and allows residents to take immediate, appropriate action. Each residential unit is worth \$30, but the municipality will

## Sewer and hydrant flushing continues

The St. Clair Township Department of Public Works will be flushing all sewer mains and fire hydrants throughout the summer between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

During work on the sewer mains, residents may notice some gurgling noise in drains. If this condition persists after 24 to 48 hours, please notify Public Works at 519-867-2993.

During work on the fire hydrants, residents may notice some discolouration while using taps, flushing toilets, doing laundry, etc. If this occurs, run the cold water tap for a few minutes or until the discolouration disappears. If discolouration continues after 10 to 15 minutes of normal use, please notify Public Works at 519-867-2993.

## Yard Waste/Brush Collection 2011

Yard waste will be collected separately from regular waste on a weekly basis in urbanized areas of St. Clair Township. Yard waste in the balance of the township will be collected during regular waste collection.

## **Collection Schedule**

Wednesdays: -Corunna (including the Froomfield area) -St. Clair Parkway (north of Emily Street in Mooretown)

Fridays: -Brigden, Courtright, Mooretown, Port Lambton

-Sombra Village, Wilkesport, Chenal Ecarte, Leeland Gardens

-St. Clair Parkway (south of Emily Street in Mooretown)

**Spring yard waste** will continue until Wednesday, June 22 and Friday, June24.

During the months of July through September, yard waste will be collected with regular waste subject to the six item limit.

**Fall yard waste** will begin Wednesday, Oct. 12 and Friday, Oct. 14 and continue until Nov. 16 and Nov. 18.

Yard waste should be placed at the roadside bagged in clear or transparent plastic bags, paper bags, or open containers clearly marked with an "X" on both sides. It must be free of non-compostable material such as plas-

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons in possession of land, in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter W.5, Sections 3, 16, and 23, that unless noxious weeds growing on their lands within the municipality of the Township of St. Clair are destroyed by the date of Tuesday, May 31, 2011, and throughout the season, the municipality may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the cost against the land, plus an administration charge as set out in the Act. (Minimum charge per parcel \$50.00)

tic, glass, metal or other debris. (A blue box or cardboard box is NOT accepted as an "open container." Containers must not exceed 23 kg/50lb. Yard waste placed in regular garbage bags will **not be collected.** 

**Yard waste includes:** grass, leaves, garden plants, hedge trimmings and twigs (generally plants with stems smaller than a lead pencil).

**Not permitted:** kitchen waste, earth, stones, tree stumps, logs, body wood, large brush, and whole shrubs with root ball attached. (See Brush Collection below).

### **Brush Collection**

Small brush bundles (4' maximum length, 1" maximum diameter, cut ends in one direction, neat piles (not tangled), tied and placed the curb) will take place June 17 and Oct. 14.
