Driveway Policy

ecommendation:

That the attached policy for private driveways abutting public roads and streets be adopted to address all new and existing driveways.

Policy (proposed):

In an effort to standardize new driveway installations, upgrades of existing driveways, and the restoration of driveways during street reconstruction projects and road paving projects, the following policy has been drafted.

- 1. Private Driveway Upgrades (on street with no curb and gutter): All driveways are to be constructed to allow positive drainage away from the edge of pavement with a minimum 4% slope across the width of the road shoulder. Concrete or interlocking stone driveways are to have a minimum 8 foot length of asphalt apron abutting the edge of pavement when located on a public road allowance.
- 2. Private Driveway Upgrades (on street with curb and gutter): Asphalt, concrete or interlocking brick driveway materials may extend to the back of curb.
- 3. Street Reconstruction Project with new Curb and Gutter (with sidewalk): All driveways will be restored with new asphalt from back of curb to sidewalk.
- 4. Street Reconstruction Project with new Curb and Gutter (no sidewalk): All driveways will be restored to match the existing material at the original edge of pavement.
- 5. Driveway Maintenance: All driveway maintenance of any material is the responsibility of the home

Sidewalks and River Trail: Concrete sidewalk and asphalt river trail will be a continuous width of concrete/asphalt through any type of driveway.
